Dear Patient,

As we are well into the New Year now, we would like to update you on what is happening at the practice.

Did you know in the last 3 months (Nov 24 – Jan 25) there were: -

18409	Telephone calls received
14390	Prescriptions requests processed
11506	GP appointments
8062	Appointments with Nurses, HCA, FCP etc
773	Missed appointments (DNAs)

Changes to how you order Prescriptions

From 1 April 2025, we will no longer accept prescription requests via email

In the last 3 months, 54% (7827) of prescription requests were manually processed ie received via email whereby a a member of staff has to manually input your request, rather than those received via NHS app which are sent direct to a GP to authorise. NHS app therefore reduces errors and saves times so that we can use a member of staff more productively to answer calls and complete other patient administration tasks.

In addition, Pharmacies across Greater Manchester will no longer accept prescriptions requests and will direct patients to NHS app or GP Practice. This has generated a further increase in workload for the Practice, and, in agreement with the Patient Forum, we ask that patients request prescriptions using the NHS App.

NHS App also lets you <u>book appointments</u> and <u>view your</u> medical records, without having to wait on the telephone.

Cancer Screening Awareness Event

Patients are invited to a Cancer Awareness Event between 11am - 2pm on Tuesday 11 March 2025 at Torkington Community Centre, Hazel Grove SK7 4PY.

We will be sharing important information about signs and symptoms of Cancer to help early detection and treatment and the importance of national Cancer screening programmes for those 25 to 70 years of age. There will be clinical professionals available to answer any questions you may have. Light refreshments will be provided.

PSA tests

There is currently **no screening programme** for prostate cancer in the UK. This is because the prostate specific antigen (PSA) blood test, which is usually the first step towards a diagnosis, is not nearly accurate enough as a primary screening test.

If you 45 - 75 years of age and are experiencing any of the following symptoms, please book an appointment with a GP for further assessment:

- Increasing frequency of urination, needing urgent visits to the toilet
- Increasing waking up at night to go to the toilet
- Incomplete emptying of your bladder, feeling like you need to go back to the toilet again soon after
- Incontinence of urine (wetting yourself)
- Urinary infections
- · Decreasing flow of urine, struggling to start urinating, dribbling
- Blood in the urine

Paramedic



You might be offered an appointment with her for acute medical issues, this includes all kinds of ailments such as chest infections, sore throats, and rashes. Amy can prescribe treatment for you or even refer on for other investigations if required. Amy is a great addition to our team

Friends and Family Test survey results

Over the last 6 months, we received 1647 responses from our patients to our Friends and Family Test survey, with average of 96% of patients rating the Practice service as Very Good or Good.

We want to thank all of our patients that submit feedback via the Friends and Family Test. We received some lovely comments which show how much you appreciate your local practice. We never claim to be perfect, but we are always trying to be better.



Patient improvement ideas

We are very grateful for patient improvement ideas, and we continue to review and implement changes where possible.

Improvement ideas we have implemented include:

- Further increased GP appointment capacity by recruiting additional GP in August 2024
- Reconfigured waiting room seating layout to allow better view of TV Screen
- Implemented new PSA testing policy at the Practice and update website
- New signage to be installed at Guywood Practice for clearer direction
- Continuing to explore funding avenues for new seating in our waiting areas

We do read all responses from our patients and strive to provide the best service we can, but we cannot implement all suggestions raised for operational and financial reasons.
